We are also looking forward to the Pop Up Folk Club on the 6th of October, and we will have a presence at the Ecovillage tent at the Tulip Festival, see further information below.

Just two of the great community events as part of the Spring Loaded Festival are first of all the Kids on

1.5km, 3.5km, 6km options. The emphasis is on participation and having fun, while enjoying the unique experience of running through the tulips and simple 'farm' obstacles. The second event is the Community Bike Ride on the 5th of October, which will go from Gutteridge Gardens to Bruce's and return. Book a spot for a complimentary drink at Bruce's Café.

Also the Try Skills is on again these school holidays for children in grades 5, 6 and 7. Participants are given the opportunity to try new sports and activities, have fun and meet new friends. The activities and clubs involved this year are gardening, WynFit, Wynyard Somerset Tennis, Ju Jitsu, DoMaur Theatre Performance, Shim Jang Taekwondo, Van Diemen's Swordfighting, Squash, Girl Guides, Sailing with the Wynyard Yacht Club and Archery. This will enable almost 50 local students to participate and try new skills.

The Waratah-Wynyard Youth Leaders (WWYL) are partnering with RAW (Rural Alive & Well) and the Tractor Trekkers for the Tulip Festival, to provide a chill out area for youth. They will be hanging out in the Community Space at the festival. WWYL will be showcasing what they do, and will have a membership drive. There will be oversized games, a bill board to provide a voice for youth and face painting for over 12 year olds.

One of the other many great projects during the Spring Loaded Festival is the 'Tree Love' initiative, which involves submitting stories, appreciation posts and general love letters about the Oak tree at Little Goldie Street. It is estimated to be about 150 years old and must have seen a huge and diverse amount of activities over those years, including at the skate park.

There will be an ecovillage at the Tulip Festival, aimed at promoting conversations about the local environment, clean energy and upcycling waste. Come and meet members of the Waratah-Wynyard Council Sustainability and Environmental Advisory panel and friends and a range of sustainability related organisations.

We have a story this month from Squid Theatre, about their background, and their production, 'The Golden Years of Radio', to be staged at the Wynyard Senior Citizens Centre, which will take audiences back to relive the decades from the 1930's to the 1950's when much of the family's entertainment was centred around the wireless. Well worth adding it to your dairy!



There is a good opportunity to have your say about youth employment: opinions are currently being sought regarding the Tasmanian Governments Youth Jobs Strategy. The transition from school to employment is one of the most significant phases of a young person's life. While 80.1% of 15 to `19 year olds in Victoria are fully engaged in study or employment, only 65.3% in Tasmania are fully engaged. 



City Mission- new operators of Wynyard Transfer Station

Council welcomed City Mission North & North West TAS as the new operators of the Wynyard Transfer Station on July 1. Access to the Wynyard Waste Transfer Station remains free for the disposal of general household waste for the following:

Residents of Waratah-Wynyard Ratepayers of Waratah-Wynyard (who may not reside in the municipal area) Recyclables – free for all users if separated from other waste. Business customers will continue to incur a disposal fee for commercial waste, even if they are residents or ratepayers.

Council is excited to move forward with the proposed Wynyard Sporting Precinct (WySP) Master Plan. The new WySP will incorporate the current Wynyard Recreation Ground, Wynyard High School and surrounding areas. The safety of facility users when moving through the precinct (which is bisected by a road) was identified as a potential concern. Closing Austin St, on the right side of Jenner St, could potentially address this concern. However, Council wishes to seek further feedback from the community before making a decision. 

This year's Spring Loaded Festival in Wynyard will feature Squid Inc Theatre's affectionate tribute to the wonderful years when radio was king in Australia. 'The Golden Years of Radio', to be staged at the Wynyard Senior Citizens Centre, will take audiences back to relive the decades from the 1930's to the 1950's when much of the family's entertainment was centred around the wireless.

Squid Inc Secretary Nick Bosly-Pask says with the generous assistance of Squid Inc's broadcast partner, Coast FM Community Radio, the show will feature much of what made radio the hub of the household including those sometimes annoying but always memorable adverts, a chance to return to the

long-running "soapies" of the era and testing the memories of the audience with a "Radio Themes" quiz. The audience will also be treated to a live demonstration of how sound effects were managed (or mis-managed) in live radio shows with the able assistance of technical producer Danny Russell! Performances of "The Golden Years of Radio", will be at 7.30pm on Friday and Saturday, the 6th and 7th of October and a matinee at 2pm on Sunday, October 8th. Entry will be by donation. SQUID INC Theatre was formed in 2021 by Wynyard couple Christina and Nick Bosly-Pask. "We wanted to provide home-grown theatre in Wynyard and the surrounding area," said Christina. Squid Inc collaborated with local community radio station Coast FM to produce *Saturday Radio Theatre*, which brought drama back to the radio. A place it had strongly held in the first half of the 20th Century, explains Nick. "Radio broadcasting in Australia turns 100 this year and many people have told us how listening to a play on the radio takes them back to 'the good old days' when the family

would gather around the wireless of an evening and listen to *The Shadow*, or how the household ground to a halt when *Blue Hills* or one of the Soaps came on during the day," he said.

SQUID INC Theatre is now heading back to the stage. In October it will present a variety show, *The Golden Years of Radio*, as part of the Spring-Loaded Festival. Christina says the plan is to have two main-stage productions in the year, along with two or three seasons of *Saturday Radio Theatre* and some smaller 'Pop Up' performances.
